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IRREGULAR ADJECTIVES: COMPARING OBJECTS AND PEOPLE

ACTIVITY 1: LET'S REMEMBER

Short adjectives(one or two syllables) add -er
and long adjectives(two or more syllables)
take MORE infront of them when we compare
two things or people.

For example:

My friend is **older** than me.

This comedy is **funnier** than the other one.

This Maths problem is **more** difficult than the
exercise.

When we compare more than two items we use

1. For short adjectives: **THE** in front of the adjective and we add **-EST** at the end of it;
2. For long adjectives: **THE MOST** in front of the adjective.

For ex.:

This is **the shortest** way.

Which is **the most** beautiful city in the world?

ACTIVITY 2

They are called **IRREGULAR ADJECTIVES**.
